FROM THE PRESIDENT – JOE LUTZ

On May 22, 2019 the Board of Directors voted to make improvements to the range. If you have visited the range recently you have noticed some of the work having already begun. In addition to approving the acquisition of a new mower and tractor, with attachments, the Board also approved necessary safety work to heighten the west berm of Pistol Bay 1, reconfigure Bay 10, improve the 500-yard rifle range firing line with a new shelter, remove and install a new shelter on Pistol Bay 1, improve drainage on Bays 1-4, and removal of the old high power rifle trailer. The cost of these acquisitions, improvements and removal total approximately \$150,000.00.

Please bear with us any delays or closures necessary for this approved work to be completed.

FUN HOUSE TAKEN DOWN – BAY 5 TO BE CONVERTED TO STANDARD CONFIGURATION

The fun house (also known as the tactical house) has been taken down and Bay 5 will be converted to a regular bay when cleared and reopened. The reason for removing the fun house is safety related. A committee is being formed to study if a new fun house can be constructed on our range in a manner consistent with accepted safety standards.

Here is some background on the decision to remove the existing fun house. For the last several years there have been multiple, serious incidents. During one short increment of time, the fun house took substantial damage with bullets routinely impacting its walls destabilizing it. The club invested significant money and the work time of members to completely rebuild it. Shortly afterwards, the walls were shot through again and the door was completely destroyed and shot off its hinges. To be clear, this damage was far beyond normal wear and tear from accidental impacts; this was clearly deliberate malfeasance. But other incidents have moved beyond destruction of range property to endangerment of the membership. Video has surfaced of a currently unidentified person using a .308 caliber rifle to directly shoot targets placed against a wall. And we have most recently confirmed new bullet holes in its front wall and upper levels. Further investigation showed at least some of these bullets exited to the unprotected North which was further confirmed by a hit on the nearby yard barn. We simply cannot have rounds crossing the parking areas and potentially exiting our facility.

The hope is that through a combination of encircling berms, better security, required training, and other measures the fun house or other tactical barrier option will return to Red Brush. But any proposals will need to be thoroughly vetted and tested before being implemented. In short, it will take time to investigate the options and make decisions.

REMINDER – HANDGUNS ONLY ON BAYS 6 THROUGH 10

There have been reports of longarms on bays 6 through 10. Please remember, only handguns may be used on these bays.

REMINDER TO MAKE SURE FINGER IS OFF TRIGGER WHEN HOLSTERING

In the February 2018 newsletter we emphasized how a quality holster is an important piece of safety equipment for handguns. However, we also warned of the danger inherent in holstering. Recently, the national news media covered a negligent discharge by a range safety officer which was likely caused by holstering with a finger on the trigger. Here is a link to one of these articles:

FROM THE RANGE OFFICER, cont...

With this background, here is a reprint of our previous newsletter article:

Holsters are an important piece of safety equipment!

With concealed carry at record levels, safely carrying a handgun when out and about is a timely topic. And one aspect which gets too little attention is the holster. While holsters are key to comfort and concealment while carrying, they are also key to safety.

The first rule of gun safety is "Always keep your muzzle pointed in a safe direction." A quality holster secures the firearm to the body preventing it from moving and pointing in unintended directions. Some holsters are even designed with retention features which keep the handgun in place during rigorous activity such as jogging. However, while a holster secures the firearm, it still requires attention to keep the firearm's muzzle pointed in a safe direction. For example, a waistband positioned holster will keep the muzzle pointed safely down while standing and sitting, it could be pointed in an unsafe direction when laying down. The same thing can occur with other styles of holsters. Pocket holsters when sitting, shoulder holsters when bending over, and ankle holsters when putting one's feet up. This must always be kept in mind when choosing a holster style and then when carrying it.

The second rule of gun safety is "Always keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot." Most holsters are designed to help with this by entirely covering the trigger. As long as the firearm is in the holster the trigger cannot be pulled. However, this also causes a danger. If the finger is on the trigger while holstering, the holster may cause your finger to press the trigger making the firearm discharge. So please take your time when holstering your firearm to make sure the finger is off the trigger.
